**REVENUES**

**Interest-Investments**

The District earns interest on its operating accounts.

**Operations & Maintenance Assessments – On Roll**

The District will levy a Non-Ad Valorem assessment on all the assessable property within the District to pay for the operating expenditures during the Fiscal Year. The collection will be provided by the Tax Collector pursuant to Section 197.3632, Florida Statutes, which is the Uniform Collection Methodology.

**Developer Contributions**

The district will direct bill and collect non-ad valorem assessments on assessable property in order to pay for the debt service expenditures during the fiscal year.

**Other Miscellaneous Revenues**

Additional revenue sources not otherwise specified by other categories.

**Special Assessments-Discounts**

Per Section 197.162, Florida Statutes, discounts are allowed for early payment of assessments only when collected by the Tax Collector. The budgeted amount for the fiscal year is calculated at 4% of the anticipated Non-Ad Valorem assessments.

**Financial and Administrative**

**Supervisor Fees**

Chapter 190 of the Florida Statutes allows for members of the Board of Supervisors to be compensated \$200 per meeting at which they are in attendance. The amount for the Fiscal Year is based upon four supervisors attending 14 meetings.

**Onsite Staff**

The district may incur expenses for employees or other staff members needed for recreational facilities such as clubhouse staff.

**District Management**

The District retains the services of a consulting manager, who is responsible for the daily administration of the District's business, including any and all financial work related to the Bond Funds and Operating Funds of the District, and preparation of the minutes of the Board of Supervisors. In addition, the District Manager prepares the Annual Budget(s), implements all policies of the Board of Supervisors and attends all meetings of the Board of Supervisors.

**Field Management**

The District has a contract with Inframark Infrastructure Management Services. for services in the administration and operation of the Property and its contractors.

**Administration**

The District receives Management, Accounting and Administrative services as part of a Management Agreement with Inframark Infrastructure Management Services.

Inframark provides recording services with near verbatim minutes.

**Construction Accounting**

Accounting services as described within the Accounting Services but specifically regarding construction.

**Financial/Revenue Collections**

Service includes all functions necessary for the timely billing and collection and reporting of District assessments in order to ensure adequate funds to meet the District's debt service and operations and maintenance obligations. These services include, but are not limited to, assessment roll preparation and certification, direct billings and funding request processing as well as responding to property owner questions regarding District assessments. This line item also includes the fees incurred for a collection agent to collect the funds for the principal and interest payment for its short-term bond issues and any other bond related collection needs. These funds are collected as prescribed in the Trust Indenture. The Collection Agent also provides for the release of liens on property after the full collection of bond debt levied on particular properties.

**Rentals and Leases**

The anticipated cost of rental expenses including but not limited to renting meeting room space for district board meetings.

**Data Storage**

Cost of server maintenance and technical support for CDD related IT needs.

**Accounting Services**

Services including the preparation and delivery of the District's financial statements in accordance with Governmental Accounting Standards, accounts payable and accounts receivable functions, asset tracking, investment tracking, capital program administration and requisition processing, filing of annual reports required by the State of Florida and monitoring of trust account activity.

**Dissemination Agent/Reporting**

The District is required by the Securities and Exchange Commission to comply with rule 15c2-12(b)-(5), which relates to additional reporting requirements for unrelated bond issues. The budgeted amount for the fiscal year is based on standard fees charged for this service.

**Website Administration Services**

The cost of web hosting and regular maintenance of the District's website by Inframark Management Services.

**District Engineer**

The District's engineer provides general engineering services to the District, i.e., attendance and preparation for board meetings when requested, review of invoices, and other specifically requested assignments.

**District Counsel**

The District's attorney provides general legal services to the District, i.e., attendance and preparation for Board meetings, review of contracts, agreements, resolutions, and other research as directed or requested by the BOS District Manager.

**Trustee Fees**

The District pays US Bank an annual fee for trustee services on the Series 2014 and Series 2015 Bonds. The budgeted amount for the fiscal year is based on previous year plus any out-of-pocket expenses.

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**Financial and Administrative** (continued)**Auditing Services**

The District is required to conduct an annual audit of its financial records by an Independent Certified Public Accounting Firm. The budgeted amount for the fiscal year is an estimate based on prior year costs.

**Postage, Phone, Faxes, Copies**

This item refers to the cost of materials and service to produce agendas and conduct day-to-day business of the District.

**Mailings**

Copies used in the preparation of agenda packages, required mailings, and other special projects.

**Professional Services – Arbitrage Rebate**

The District is required to annually calculate the arbitrage rebate liability on its Series 2013A and 2020 bonds.

**Legal Advertising**

The District is required to advertise various notices for monthly Board meetings and other public hearings in the newspaper of general circulation.

**Bank Fees**

This represents the cost of bank charges and other related expenses that are incurred during the year.

**Dues, Licenses and Fees**

This represents the cost of the District's operating license as well as the cost of memberships in necessary organizations.

**Onsite Office Supplies**

This represents the cost of supplies used to prepare agenda packages, create required mailings, and perform other special projects. The budget for this line item also includes the cost for supplies in the District office.

**Website ADA Compliance**

Cost of maintaining district website's compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990.

**Disclosure Report**

On a quarterly and annual basis, disclosure of relevant district information is provided to the Muni Council, as required within the bond indentures.

**Annual Stormwater Report**

Cost to produce annual report on CDD stormwater infrastructure.

**Miscellaneous Administrative**

All other administrative costs not otherwise specified above.

**Insurance**

**Insurance-General Liability**

The District's General Liability & Public Officials Liability Insurance policy is with Egis Insurance Advisors, LLC. The budgeted amount allows for a projected increase in the premium.

**Public Officials Insurance**

The District will incur expenditures for public officials' liability insurance for the Board and Staff and may incur a 10% premium increase.

**Property & Casualty Insurance**

The District will incur fees to insure items owned by the district for its property needs.

**Deductible**

District's share of expenses for insured property when a claim is filed.

**EXPENDITURES**

**Utility Services**

**Electric Utility Services**

Electricity for accounts with the local Utilities Commissions for the swim club, parks, and irrigation. Fees are based on historical costs for metered use.

**Streetlights**

Local Utility Company charges electricity usage (maintenance fee). The budget is based on historical costs.

**Lighting Replacement**

Cost of replacing defective lights and bulbs in CDD facilities.

**Decorative Light Maintenance**

Cost of replacement and repair of decorative lighting fixtures.

**Amenity Internet**

Internet service for clubhouse and other amenity locations.

**Water/Waste**

The District charges each new water/sewer system customer an Accrued Guaranteed Revenue Fee (AGRF) for wastewater service in accordance with the adopted rate schedule.

**Gas**

Cost of natural gas for CDD facilities. Regular fuel costs (automobile etc.)

**Facility A/C & Heating R&M**

Cost of repairs and regular maintenance of Air Conditioning and central heating of CDD facilities.

**Utilities – Other**

Utility expenses not otherwise specified in above categories.

**Recreation/Park Facility Maintenance**

Cost of upkeep and repairs to all parks and recreation facilities in the CDD

**Athletic Courts and Field Maintenance**

Cost of upkeep and repairs for athletic fields and courts (ex. Basketball Courts) on CDD property.

**Park Restroom Maintenance**

Upkeep and cleaning of park restrooms on CDD property.

**Playground Equipment and Maintenance**

Cost of acquisition and upkeep of playground equipment for CDD parks.

**Clubhouse Office Supplies**

Cost of supplies for clubhouse clerical duties (pens, paper, ink, etc.)

**Clubhouse IT Support**

Cost of IT services and for clubhouse operational needs.

**Dog Waste Station Service & Supplies**

Cost of cleaning and resupplying dog waste stations.

Cost of CDD security personnel and equipment.

**Special Events**

Cost of holiday celebrations and events hosted on CDD property.

**Community Activities**

Cost of recreational events hosted on CDD property.

**Holiday Decorations**

Cost of decorations for major holidays (i.e., Christmas)

**Miscellaneous Amenity**

Amenity Expenses not otherwise specified.

**Landscape and Pond Maintenance**

**R&M – Stormwater System**

Cost of repairs and regular maintenance to the CDD's stormwater and drainage infrastructure.

**Landscape Maintenance - Contract**

Landscaping company to provide maintenance consisting of mowing, edging, trimming, blowing, fertilizing, and applying pest and disease control chemicals to turf throughout the District.
